ESCAPE FROM PARADISE

Whether you prefer the Atlantic, the Gulf Coast or the interior during the cold winter months, there's always a destination in Florida with lots of sun, warm breezes, and as much, or as little, to do as your want—and you might even just unexpectedly get married.

Having traveled along Florida's coastline for weeks last winter we soon realized that the building boom has made it often impossible to even get a glimpse of the ocean or Gulf Coast at certain parts of the sunshine state. And so we were really happy when we finally discovered the Palm Coast and its beautiful Flagler Beaches, 31 miles south of St. Augustine and 24 miles north of Daytona Beach ideally situated on the northeast coast of Florida between the Intracoastal Waterway on one side and by the Atlantic Ocean on the other.

Here driving along the scenic A1A we felt as if we had rediscovered a piece of the old Florida with wide-open ocean views. The 72-mile segment of historic State Road A1A abounds with white sandy beaches, ample recreational adventures, and history dating back before the birth of this county. We explored the second largest outcropping of coquina rocks on the Atlantic Coast when we visited Washington Oaks Gardens State Park.

We found a home for the winter in the charming 'Sea Colony' oceanfront community and fell in love with 'Flagler Beach'. Home to circa 5,000 residents, this is a charming beach town which reminds me a lot of Montauk. Since its incorporation in 1925, Flagler Beach has grown from a sleepy fishing village to a unique seaside community while retaining much of its original charm. It is home to un-crowded beaches, many great fishing spots including the Flagler Beach Municipal Pier, restaurants with ocean-front and Intracoastal Waterway dining, gift shops, an awesome farmer's market and a whole host of recreational facilities. www.destinationflaglerbeach.com

Every day on the Palm Coast turned somehow into an 'Eco Adventure' for us! Florida's nearly perfect winter weather enticed us to hit the roads and biking trails often. Six of the Palm Coast and Flagler Beach trails are listed on the Great Florida Birding Guide, which boasts a myriad of birding opportunities.

We experienced excellent boating and fishing and surfcasting on the Atlantic Ocean and the Intracoastal Waterway, a large stretch of water just west of the Atlantic Ocean that creates the barrier islands. From there both boaters and fisherman can meander through creeks and marshlands for a day of fishing. Those looking for a fresh water experience can venture out through Haw Creek to Dead Lake or Crescent Lake to view osprey, great blue herons, turtles and even alligators as they bask in the sun.

Palm Coast and Flagler Beach is home to numerous state, county and local parks and preserves. Three are part of the state park system. Washington Oaks Gardens State Park consists of 425 acres of coastal scenery as well as 20 acres of formal gardens. Visitors can picnic and fish from either the beach or the seawall along the Matanzas River. Gamble Rogers Memorial State Recreational Area is bordered by the Atlantic Ocean on the east and by the Intracoastal Waterway on the west. Each month the park offers a Full Moon Hike led by one of the rangers! And at Bulow Plantation Ruins Historic State Park you can explore the ruins for the former sugarcane plantation, a sugar mill, unique springhouse and several wells showing the volatility of the Florida frontier in the early 19th century.

Palm Coast offerings are varied, from historic Princess Place Preserves where you can tour a beautifully preserved 1888 hunting lodge fit for a princess, who indeed lived here for many years, to the Malacompra Road Beachfront Park that offers trails through a maritime oak hammock and ocean scrub community. This 36-acre park overlooks the longest exposed outcropping of coquina rock, monuments of spectacular sculpting created by the rising sea 5,000 years ago on the Florida East Coast.

When one spends the winter away from home one has to find not only nourishment for the body (like great organic farm stands on the weekly farmer's market www.flaglerbeachfarmersmarket.com) but also nourishment for the soul.

I should explain that my fiancée Marcus and I had been considering getting married some time in October this year at home. Marcus is Catholic and it is important to him that we would get married by a priest, who normally requires at least 6-months notice and some couple's counseling. Considering our lifestyle that we reside between at least 3 homes and are traveling often, we had problems fulfilling these requirements because we are never long enough at one spot—and to be honest Marcus does not like big wedding celebrations and neither do I.

We had a meeting with Father Al at the Santa Maria del Mar Catholic Church in Flagler Beach (www.smdmcc.org) whom we really like and were attending church regularly. We explained to him in detail our situation and also that we are intending to spend our winters here. Make a long story short; we got his blessing to get married in his church before we would leave Florida. It was a beautiful ceremony and a simple celebration with a nice lunch afterwards catered at home with just a few close friends attending. Marcus brother who lives in St. Augustine was my husband's best man and my girlfriend Phyllis from Montauk was my maid of honor. The kids were with us over Skype and in their thoughts.
