HELPING HANDS

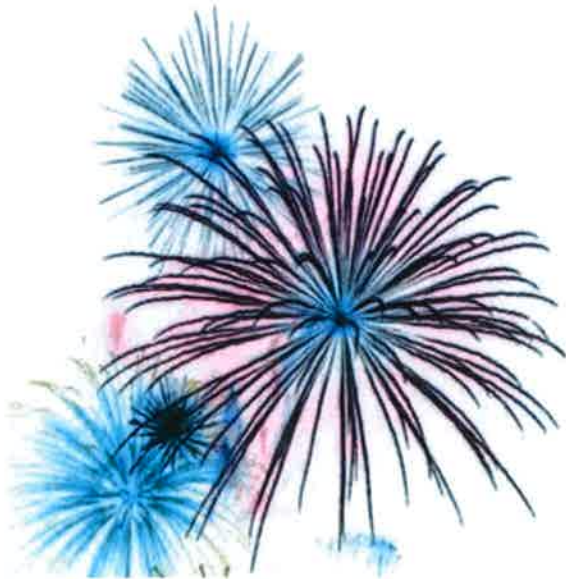
