### SEA COLONY RESTORATION UPDATE

This information is being shared to inform all residents of the work currently underway to assist us in returning Sea Colony to Pre-Matthew standards.

- **Our Beach Dunes**—Discussions continue with the County Administration related to Dune restoration. The search continues for acceptable sand and work is set to begin around the beginning of May. We are all very concerned about the timelines for this work and will continue to monitor the County's progress daily.
- **Walkover**—P & G Construction will prepare two designs for replacing the walkover closest to the Club House. The first design will follow our original plan and the second will include a handicap accessible option. P & G is continuing to work with the State and, based on Board approval for the design, will work with the State for the CCCL (Costal Control Construction Line) permit. Construction Line will be determined once the Dunes are restored.
- **FEMA**—Our request for funds to correct the damage done by Hurricane Matthew has been rejected. We are currently applying for a Small Business Loan to help finance repairs.
- **Club House**—Repair of the Cupola is nearly completed and our fenced area (inside the Club House) should be gone by the end of the week.
- **Lakes**—A written report from the University Extension group who evaluated our waters is being prepared and the Lakes committee will be looking at options for future restoration of our waters. It is not recommended that we drain our lakes and use of the water for irrigation in the near future is not likely. The Extension Scientist did restate that Human Waste Contaminants are not present in our lakes.
- **The Oak Trees**—The Arborist that began evaluation of our trees was encouraged by his initial investigations and requested that we give the trees another month to recover. In the mean time we will begin watering with City water as soon as the system can be coordinated to carry the water effectively to the North side of Sea Colony Drive. Keep your fingers crossed that the Arborist will find many healthy trees when he returns.
- **Common Areas**—The Consultant from the Long Range Planning Committee is working on recommendations for renewing our landscape in the common areas. Focus will be on designs that do not require extensive irrigation. His suggestions will be presented a the May Board Meeting.
- **Smaller Projects**—The sand spill at Medford and Sea Colony Dr. was cleaned up by Five Star and the dead Palm tree near Medford will also be removed. The AT&T building has been cleaned and the dead hedge on Sea Colony Dr. has been removed.

We hope that this information is helpful to each of our residents and that we will continue to make progress as quickly as possible with both the County and State toward the accomplishment of our goals.

**WHEREAS**, Harry Gildred has been a resident of Flagler County for over 25 years; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Gildred has been a bicycle enthusiast for many years including, as a student, heading up a bike club at Boston University and working on bike ways in River Vale, NJ before relocating to Flagler County; and

**WHEREAS**, Harry Gildred took on a leadership role in Flagler County as an advocate for pathway and bicycling; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission recognize bicycling as a viable and environmentally sound form of transportation and an excellent form of recreation; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Gildred served as Chair and long-time member of the Bike/Pedestrian Pathways Advisory Committee and on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Gildred worked diligently to promote the importance of having bike ways within Flagler, as well as, providing connectivity to Volusia and St. Johns counties; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Gildred was a driving force behind planning and obtaining Commission support to pursue funding for the A1A Bikeway; and

**WHEREAS**, Harry Gildred, in the mid-1990's, single handedly presented to the granting agency a proposal and was awarded for Flagler County, one of the Florida's first Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act grant in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the original A1A Bikeway; and


**WHEREAS**, the Commission bicycle friendly communities improve citizens' health, well-being, and quality of life and wishes to acknowledge Mr. Gildred for his service to this cause; and

**WHEREAS**, that wish to thank Mr. Gildred for his work and commitment to biking in Flagler County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE FLAGLER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS** does here recognize and commend Harry Gildred for his tireless dedication to the Flagler County Community.

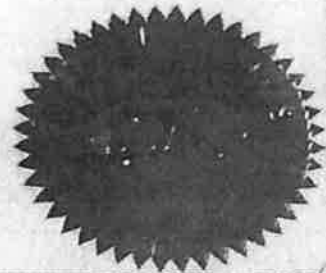
