Take 206 West until the end, turn left on 207, go through Hastings center (2 blocks) and County Line will be on the left, across from Bull's Hit Ranch. They will be very appreciative if you bring your own bags. Make it a real road trip and continue on 207, turning right at 100, cross

Recycling

Confused with the new times? Please don't stop recycling as much as you can. Flagler County website has lists of what can and can't be recycled at flaglercounty.org. Use the hazardous waste facility on 1700 S Old Kings Rd for paints, pesticides, batteries and other hazardous waste. Waste Pro also has good information on their site, wasteprousa.com If you haven't done so already, please stop using plastic bags

and straws. When Publix asks, "Is plastic ok?", answer like all of the 2nd graders in Flagler County: "I brought my own!" We all can be better stewards of our environment.

Turtle Nesting Season

About 90% of all sea turtle nesting's in the United States takes place in Florida. Loggerheads, Green and leatherbacks nest on our beaches, mostly at night, between now and the end of October. Many of the nests are relocated by the Turtle Patrol to safer spots and marked off. After an incubation period of 45-55 days the hatchlings rely on the light from the ocean to guide them to the water, so please do not use flashlights or camera lights on the beach at night. Make sure any holes are filled in and do not let your dogs near the marked off nests. Let's do all we can to ensure a successful season. If you come upon a sick or dead turtle, please call FWC Wildlife Alert number at 888-404-3922
