## PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE SQUIRRELS!

It's never fun to find peanut shells in your dug-up yard or squirrels climbing on your porch screen. There are so many reasons why you should not feed them.

-People food is not good for any wildlife including squirrels. Peanuts are not a natural food source for them

-Feeding makes them lose their natural fear of humans

- Some squirrels are known to get aggressive when not fed
- Squirrels carry diseases and parasites. Their urine and feces contain a variety of diseases including salmonella and leptospirosis. Think about that one before you put your next peanut snack!
- Squirrels breed more and give birth to large litters when food is plentiful
