

Sea Colony and Florida State Pool Regulations – January 2013

Pool Area Open - 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Each Sea Colony resident is responsible for compliance with these regulations by all members of household and guests. Pool tags, wristbands, or scan cards required.

No lifeguard on duty. Swim at your own risk.

Florida State Pool/Spa Regulations:

NO DIVING.

Maximum 35 people in pool.

Shower before entering pool/spa.

No animals of any type in pool area.

No glass in pool area.

No drinks or snacks within 4 feet of pool/spa.

Both gates must be closed and latched at all times.

Spa – Maximum use 15 minutes.

Maximum 10 people in spa.

Maximum water temp. 104 degrees F.

No oils, body lotions, or soaps in spa.

All chairs and tables must be kept 4 feet from pool edge.

Sea Colony Rules:

No running, jumping or horseplay.

Only bathing suits in pool/spa – NO street clothes.

No open sores or skin diseases.

No loud radios, glass, bikes, Frisbees, skates, skateboards, surfboards, or rafts in pool area or clubhouse walkways.

Only floatation devices permitted are those worn on the body.

Only beach balls allowed in pool.

When in use, chairs/lounges must be covered by a towel. Do not reserve chairs/lounges when leaving the area.

Untrained/Diapered children are NOT allowed in pool/spa. The individual plastic pools stored by the phone may be used on the pool deck.

Children under 12 must have adult supervision in pool area. Non-swimming children must be kept within arm's length of supervising adult. Guests under 16 must be accompanied by parent or resident when pool attendant not on duty.

Everyone must exit the pool area on the occurrence of thunder and lightning and wait 30 minutes after the most recent occurrence before reentering. No wet suits in clubhouse – use bathrooms and porch only. No smoking in pool/spa or on wall rims. Please close all umbrellas when not in use.

Please wash off all beach chairs and coolers brought onto deck from the ocean. Surfboards and other beach items are to be carried to and from the beach via wooden walkover just south of the pool rather than through pool deck.
